

Hans Christian Andersen: A biography

Procedure:

- 1.- Divide the class into two groups A and B and give each one a version of the text. Tell them to read it carefully and to learn the most important data by heart. Give them about 10 – 15 minutes. Then collect the text.
- 2.- Pair students from group A with students from group B so that each member of the pair has read one version of the text. Tell to find the eight differences between the two texts and to write them down. Point out that the easiest way to find the differences would be to tell each other as many data as they remember from the biography. If they cannot find the eight differences, let them read the text again after some minutes.
- 3.- When they finish, tell them to go on the Internet to check which information is true. They can use the link on the text.
